We want you to have a safe holiday season this year! Here are some quick tips!

- Check for freshness when shopping for a "live" Christmas tree. A fresh tree will have resin on the cut end (you will need to cut off the resin so

the tree can absorb water). If you tug at the needles or tap the tree on the ground only a few needles will fall out.

- When you bring your tree home, find the perfect spot away from the fireplace and heating vents.
- Check the holiday lights and throw out any strings with frayed wires. Replace broken and burned out lights. Don't string together more than **three** sets of lights.
- Place breakable ornaments towards the top of tree out of the reach of young children and pets.
- Place lit menorahs away from decorations and drapes.
- Turn off holiday lights when you leave the house or go to bed, timers work great!
- Don't place your wrapped gifts in your windows. If Santa brings you a new computer or a plasma TV, don't leave your boxes on the curb for bulk trash, break them down and put in your recycle bin.
- If you are going out of town, let your neighbor know so they can keep an eye on your house and pick up your mail.

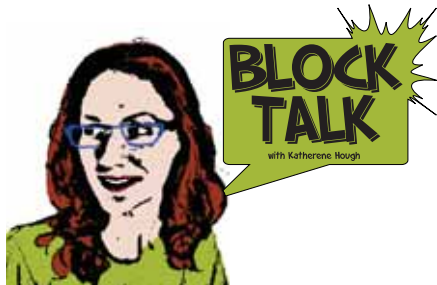

## Burglars Are Holiday Shopping. Are You Prepared?

On a recent drive through the neighborhood, I saw the glow of many flat-screens as I looked out my car window. Unfortunately, we aren't the only ones window shopping for the holiday gift giving season. Burglars are looking for things to pawn/sell for cash. This includes packages and boxes delivered to your home. Of the 12 burglaries thus far in 2010, 9 have happened since August. Burglaries of homes typically happen during working hours on weekdays. Burglaries of garages/sheds are more common at night. Take measures to protect your home. Use your alarm if you have one. Examine all doors. Is any part of the door hollow core? Can it be easily kicked in? Install window locks on your windows. Keep your curtains and blinds closed at night! Do not allow valuables to be seen from your front door or front windows. Talk to your postal/Fed Ex, UPS carriers about making sure packages and boxes are not left where they are visible from the street. Call the Dallas Neighborhood Policing Office at 214.670.4420 if you would like a security audit done on your home. 

## People Really Do Win...

State Representative Allen Vaught had the pleasure of trying them all, and each one could have easily been the winner. Drum roll please... Betsy Porter's wonderful Carrot Cake Cupcakes won first place. Congratulations Betsy. She will be enjoying a beautiful Lakewood Theater frame print donated by our neighborhood graphic artist Walter Soza of Soza.

### Ingredients for the cupcake:

- 2 cups sugar
- 1 1/3 cups vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 3 extra-large eggs
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 3 cups grated carrots (less than 1 pound)
- 1 cup raisins
- 1 cup chopped walnuts

### Ingredients for the frosting:

- 3/4 pound cream cheese, at room temperature
- 1/2 pound unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1 pound confectioners' sugar

### For the decorations:

- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 cup grated or shaved carrots
- 3 tablespoons good maple syrup



### Directions

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.

Beat the sugar, oil, and eggs together in the bowl of an electric mixer fitted with the paddle attachment until light yellow. Add the vanilla. In another bowl, sift together 2 cups flour, the cinnamon, baking soda and salt. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients. Toss the carrots, raisins, and the walnuts with 1 tablespoon flour. Add to the batter and mix well by my hand. Scoop the batter into the muffin cups until each is almost full. Bake for 10 minutes on 400 degrees, then lower the oven to 350 degrees and bake for 35 minutes. Let cool on rack.

For the frosting, mix the cream cheese, butter, and vanilla in the bowl of an electric mixer fitted with the paddle attachment until just combined. Add the sugar and mix until smooth. For the decoration, melt the butter in a skillet over medium heat; add the carrots and maple syrup and sauté for 2 - 3 minutes, until the carrots are tender. Spread them on a paper towel to cool. When the cupcakes are cool, frost them generously and garnish with big pinches of sautéed carrots.

I used to think Vickery Park was just a bar, but it is definitely a restaurant, too. Vickery isn't some bar with wings and nachos. They take the food as seriously as they do their large and changing selection of craft beers. The menu is not extensive, but the variety of appetizers, salads, entrees and sandwiches is more than adequate to please lots of different palates.

I really like the Trio of Dips on the appetizer menu. These dips don't come off a Sysco truck; all are house-made. I think what really gets me though are the house-made corkscrew potato chips, yum!!

They are delicious. They are too thin for the dips, perhaps. But no one at Vickery will fuss at you for digging them out with your fingers, except maybe your fellow diners. I certainly haven't tried everything on the menu, but the burger has won me over as one of the best in town. I have tried the brisket sandwich with Kahlua cream sauce. It is served on a somewhat sweet bun and is an acquired taste. I am not sold on that sauce just yet, but it's pretty popular. Both the brisket and the pulled pork at Vickery are slow-cooked and tender. The pulled pork is available on a sandwich with a spicy hoisin sambal sauce or in the late-night tacos, which are very yummy. There also is a good cheese plate. Vickery is pretty well known for its brunch and its mussels. I haven't had either, but have friends who love both. If you haven't been there and would like to try it out, I would recommend going on Tuesday nights. All menu items are half price, except the Ribeye, a true bargain at half the price.
